


PASTORAL LETTER

I woke to another dreary day. It was wet, with little to cheer me. What is more, it was the second day of Lent. I am entering this period in introspection when I may become aware of faults in my life that need to change. Although at first this may seem to be a time of self-appraisal that can be a negative experience, it can lead me to jettison practices that are harmful to me and those with whom I live.

Traditionally, we are expected to identify what to 'give up for lent' in order to become better people. Perhaps it would be a more positive experience if we found something to introduce to our living that would make us more productive and unselfish.

When Maundy Thursday has come after the 40 days of Lent, will there have been any significant change in me, and will I have found anything to cheer my mood that I previously described? The weather may well have improved, but what else could have lifted my spirits in a world that currently gets more dangerous every day?

Thankfully, I can read the final page of the story that occurs beyond the 40 days. I will have followed the journey that Jesus took. I will have travelled along the road past his unjust trial and crucifixion according to Roman law. If that is where I finish my Lenten journey, I will remain in my state of despair. It would be as if the resurrection had never happened.

But it has – and this changes everything. There is hope, and we will come to Easter Day knowing that, with the resurrection of Jesus Christ, a new day has dawned. There is hope for the world, and for individuals like me.







Church Services Some terms explained (see back cover)

HC: Holy Communion, also called 'The Eucharist' and, by some, 'Mass'. If taken by a non-ordained person then it is 'by extension'.

BCP: Book of Common Prayer, published in 1662 and still an accepted form of liturgy.

CW: Common Worship. A form of service, launched 2000, which uses modern language.

'Said': no hymns in the service.
